JAMES A. MORGAN

James A. Morgan was born in April, 1909, in Shelbyville Indiana, only a few miles from the birthplace of Eddy C. Jerman, in whose memory this annual lecture is given. After primary schooling in Shelbyville, he graduated from high school in Cincinnati where he also attended St. Gregory College,

In 1933, Mr. Morgan entered training in radiologic technology at Firmen Desloge Hospital of St. Louis University. After basic training, a career as technician, instructor and supervisor was pursued until 1946 when he transferred his activity to the technical section of an x-ray manufacturing organization. With the exception of a two-year interval as technical supervisor at the Mallinckrodt Institute of Radiology in St. Louis, Mr. Morgan has been a member for eighteen years of the x-ray technical group, organized by Ed. C. Jerman within the Victor X-Ray Corporation, predecessor of the present General Electric Company, X-Ray Department.

Mr. Morgan joined The American Society of Radiologic Technologists immediately after certification by The American Registry of Radiologic Technologists in 1938. He served the Society in appointments as a member and chairman of the Affiliation and Publication Committees and was Editor of The X-Ray Technician, predecessor of RADIOLOGIC TECHNOLOGY, for six years. In 1941, Mr. Morgan was elected President of The American Society of Radiologic Technologists. He was selected as an instructor at the first refresher course sponsored by the national society in 1939, and since 1962, he has conducted the annual refresher course on Fundamental XI-Ray Physics for student-technologists at the national convention. Through the years, Mr. Morgan has conducted well over five hundred refresher courses on the application of x-ray in medical radiography for technicians as well as residentradiologists-in-training throughout the United States and Canada. His x-ray technical writings have been numerous and published in technical and hospital journals. He is the author of THE ART AND SCIENCE OF MEDICAL RADIOGRAPHY and co-author of MEDICAL RADIOGRAPHIC TECHNIC, two widely used texts in x-ray training centers.

The Missouri Society of Radiologic Technologists is honored and privileged to name James A. Morgan, R.T., the Sante Memorial Lecturer for 1969.





LIST OF RULES GOVERNING EXHIBITS FOR THE MISSOURI SOCIETY OF RADIOLOGICAL TECHNOLOGISTS

- Any active or associate member of the MSRT is eligible to submit an exhibit.
- 2. The entry may consist of an educational exhibit relative to radiologic technology, radioisotope technology, or radiotherapy technology.

- 3. Exhibits should be marked so as to obscure the name of the hospital, office, patient, and technician involved. The technical factors employed must be shown. Any other technical information the contributor wishes to add may also be included.
- No exhibit which won an award at a previous MSRT convention shall be displayed.
- 5. Neither the Missouri Society of Radiologic Technologists, nor the members of the Exhibit Committee are responsible for films submitted for the convention; however, all reasonable care will be taken to insure their safety.
- 6. The judge shall take into consideration such things as technical quality (contrast, density, positioning, etc.) and the difficulty of securing the view and the interest it holds for technicians in general.

Additional rules to be added to contest qualifications for the MIS-SOURI SOCIETY OF RADIOLOGICAL TECHNOLOGISTS EXHIBITS.

- 1. The eligibility of contestants must be examined by the exhibit committee and at least one member of the Executive Committee before any judging takes place.
- 2. The treasurer will certify that contestants dues are paid to date.
- 3. Contestants must be members in good standing of the Missouri Society of Radiological Technologists at least thirty days before the date of the stated meeting at which they exhibit.
- 4. The Exhibit Committee will not divulge or discuss the place of an contestant other than those announced at the meeting.
- 5. The decision of the judges will be final.

The Exhibit Committee should decide each year by what method the films should reach the convention city.


