BOARD MEMBERS MEET IN ROLLA

There was a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Missouri Society of Radiologic Technologists held at Rolla, Missouri, May 6, 1970. At this meeting there was much discussion of the relationship of the technologist with the Missouri society. It was reported at this meeting that many members have failed to renew their membership. Some of these possibly have failed to do so because they were unhappy with the society. One district of the state sent a representative to this meeting with a number of questions and complaints from his particular district. In answer to those throughout the state who have wondered why you have not been receiving the MISSOURI MINUTES, this has not been printed through this period of time because

there was no editor. Many of the other complaints and problems discussed during this meeting were found to have developed because of a lack of communication between the board members and the technologists. The executive board members must many times act upon decisions which must be made at a particular time; many times they operate on a time limit. It would be very helpful if districts would, as far as possible, send representatives to these meetings in order to relay the transactions of the society back to the various districts throughout the state.

We are going to attempt to send a copy of this paper to all members of the Missouri Society of Radiologic Technologists, whether active, honorary, or student. It was brought to our attention at this meeting that perhaps there are many questions in the minds of the technologists across the state. If you have questions concerning the actions of the society, the society is prepared to give reason for its actions and business transactions.

HAVE YOU PAID YOUR MISSOURI SOCIETY DUES?

No member who is in arrears for dues shall vote or hold office, or shall be entitled to receive reports of the transactions of the society. It shall be the duty of the Secretary-Treasurer to erase from the rolls of membership the name of any person who is in arrears for more than 90 days. Any member dropped from the rolls for nonpayment of dues may be reinstated only upon applying for reinstatement and payment of the dues for the year in which he is reinstated, and a reinstatement fee not to exceed an amount equivalent to the annual dues. This is noted in the by-laws of the society in Chapter V, Section 7.

EXHIBIT RULES ANNUAL M.S.R.T. MEETING

Exhibits are a visible stimulus at any meeting! They not only provide a source of pride to the exhibitor, but exemplify the art and science of technology upon which our organization is based.

- Exhibits shall be limited to medical applications of ionizing radiations to include x-ray, nuclear medicine, and radiation therapy technology.
- Radiographs used should have any patient identification obscured. The exhibitor's name and affiliation should be indicated.

- A maximum of 4 view boxes* may be assigned to any exhibit.
- Only members and student members of the M.S.R.T. are eligible for awards.
- Exhibits may include "gadget exhibits" of interest to radiologic technologists such as teaching aids, historical memorabilia, etc.
- 6. Exhibits must be on display by 12 noon on Thursday, October 1st and remain intact until noon on Saturday, October 3rd.
 - *The limitation of view boxes is relevant to the supply available. If more are needed, and you can provide them, BUT NOT TO EXCEED 8, please contact the exhibit chairman and he will clarify arrangements with you.
