THE
REGIONAL DIRECTOR

"a philosophy and a report"

For two years, I'll be your representative to the board of Directors of the American Society of Radiologic Technologists. I will be looking to you for advice and opinions on issues both old and new. It is my intention to keep you informed of pertinent data and decisions from that board. I remind you that I can be only as effective as you allow, to the degree that you communicate with me.

In Philadelphia, at the annual ASRT meeting, I had the opportunity to meet with the members of each state society, and I discussed with them the issue that I wish to discuss with you now, that being the possibility of having a regional meeting in lieu of five separate meetings. We could plan on doing something like this once every three or four years. Possible advantages of an arrangement like this would include providing a more economical way of giving better continuing education programs to more people, and the topics could be of a wider variety. With a larger number of people attending, it could be possible to arrange for college credit to be given. The meeting could be a vehicle for sharing and evaluating problems of the various states in the region, eliminating some of the redundancy seen when they all cope with the same problems in different ways or at different times.

This would not, however, be an easy project. I imagine that a task force consisting of one or two members from each state would have to be formed. A central allocation must be found. It is possible for us to seek the guidance of the ASRT Meeting Co-ordinator, Ms. Barbara Palan. The cost to us for this would be limited to her fare to the location and room and board, I do feel that her assistance in the mechanical aspects would be invaluable.

Business sessions for each affiliate society would have to be held separately so that each society could carry on its work, elections, etc.

Information that I need from you now is: How do you feel about helping to arrange a meeting like this? Would your employer support your going to a state society function in another state? If it were in someplace like Kansas City,

would the distance be a prohibitive factor? How would it affect your student attendance? I would appreciate hearing from each of you.

BRIEFS FROM PHILADELPHIA

Gary Brink, Mallinkrodt at St. Louis, has been appointed chairman of the standing committee on Professional Affairs. (Gary's expertise on the subjects of NEC, labor relations, etc. Canbe invaluable to you. Don't hesitate to contact him for guidance).

John B. Cahoon lecture series has been established via a resolution from the floor at the annual ASRT business session.

S3203, an amendment to the National Labor Relations Act has been adopted by the U.S. Senate and the House of Representatives, and has gone to the President for signature. This extends the coverage and protection of the NLRA to employees of non-profit hospitals.

Dues increas for ASRT members was voted upon by the membership attending the Philadelphia meeting. Pending mail ratification, dues will be thirty dollars for active members.

Evidence of Continuing Education, through a document approved by the ASRT and the ARRT boards will be implemented in 1975. There is much yet to be done regarding the mechanics and arrangement, but the concept has been established. Dr. Armand Brodeur's lecture, "Radiologic Pathology of the Genito-Urinary Tract" is now available for rental from the ASRT. This is a self contained learning unit consisting of tapes and radiographs.

The American Society of Radiologic Technologists is pleased to announce a new concept in Continuing Education for Radiologic Technologists. The Institute to be held at Memphis State University, Memphis, Tennessee on October 23-26, 1974 will be the first American Society of Radiological Technologists sponsored educational program to provide graduate or undergraduate college credit.

The objectives of the course are to provide:

1. An opportunity for exposure to innovative teaching-learning strategies applicable in Radiologic Technology.
2. Assist in the development of learning materials to be utilized in the participant's environment.

The course will be presented in a series of resource laboratories, assigned readings, mini-action workshops, interaction feedback sessions, individualized and self instructional packages. Unlike previous Institutes programs, these sessions will last 3 days, beginning 7:30 P.M. on October 23, and terminating by 4:00 P.M. on October 26, 1974.

Individual flyers and pre-registration packets will be sent out by Memphis State University. It will be important to remember that the pre-registration deadline is set in conjunction with the University's registration process and Pre-registration is essential.

The June Scanner will detail all facts concerning the Institute. A package plan has been developed to provide college credit, housing, and meals. Should you not receive your Scanner or Institute flyer contact the ASRT Executive office.

CHARTER A BUS TO THE 1974 ANNUAL MEETING OF THE M.S.R.T

The 1974 annual meeting of the Missouri Society of Radiologic Technologists will be held in Cape Girardeau, Missouri, October 9, 10, and 11th. PROFESSIONAL AFFAIRS NEWS

This newsletter is being sent to inform the M.S.R.T membership of the pending legislation that will be passed by the Congress of the United States in the near future.

This legislation pertains to the inclusion of medical personnel under the National Labor Relations Act. Our national society has gone on record as supporting this legislation.

This law, when enacted, will give medical personnel the right to negotiate with their employer; wages, working conditions, hours, etc. in a concerted effort without fear of termination or reprisal.

When the passage of this law becomes effective, there will be active unionization by the trade unions in hospitals. They will organize the service employees first, but if the institution is small, they could possibly draw other para-medical personnel into their bargaining unit without the knowledge or acceptance of the para-medical group.

It is, therefore, for this reason that the board of directors of the M.S.R.T., through the Professional Affairs Committee, has retained the law firm of Rabbit, Rabbit, and Dickerson, and has requested this firm to familiarize itself with the history, present problems, and future needs of Radiologic Technology in the State of Missouri.

This law firm will advise any technologist or group of technologists of the M.S.R.T. concerning their professional affairs on a fee basis.

The State Professional Affairs Committee also wishes to inform the membership that Phase IV, the Federal program regulating the amount of salary increase to medical employees, ceased to be in force as of April 30, 1974. This program stipulated a 5.5 percentage basis which has existed since August 15, 1971 to the present, and this regulation of wage increase has restricted our earnings to the extent that we are now below the average economic standing in the United States. Therefore, it is the recommendation of this committee that when we negotiate for periodic raises we do not accept the excuse that our raises are limited by Federal regulations.

On May 1st of this year the minimum wage was upgraded from \$1.65 per hour to \$1.90 per hour which is an increase of 15%. A year from now the minimum wage will reach \$2.10 and by 1976 it will be \$2.30 per hour. Keep in mind that these figures pertain to non-professional personnel and therefore have no direct proportion to our salaries, but it is possible that these increases will result in a "halo" effect that will be to our financial benefit.

MINUTES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

The quarterly meeting of the MSRT Board of Directors and Committee Chairpersons was called to order at 10:30 a.m. by Ron Ott, R.T., President, at the Holiday Inn, in Cape Girardeau, Missouri, Saturday, July 27, 1974.

As of July 15, 1974, the MEMBERSHIP REPORT listed the following renewals for 1974-75: 152 Active, 29 Student, 22 Associate, 7 Inactive, 1 Life, and 2 Honorary.

Ron Ott, STATE REPRESENTATIVE TO THE ASRT CONVENTION, reported these proposals being adopted by the ASRT Convention, however they must be ratified by the ASRT membership as a whole before they will go into effect. They were as follows: To increase the ASRT dues to \$30.00 per year; to adopt standing rules which would be in effect from year to year as a supplement to the existing bylaws; campaign material should not be used in conjunction with regional directors or other officers running for office; the term technologist is always to be used instead of technician; and that Board members would serve a two year, instead of three year, term. Ron stated that Gary Brink, Mallinkrodt of St. Louis, has been appointed chairman of the standing committee on Professional Affairs.

NOMINATION COMMITTEE REPORT stated these individuals have agreed to run for these respective offices: President Elect--Gary Brink, R.T. and Merlin Heinselman, R.T.; Vice President--Mary Sebacher, R.T. and Norman Hente, R.T.; Secretary--Marquita Fiddmont, R.T. and Marie Bockey, R.T.; Treasurer--None; Eastern Counselor--Terry Karch, R.T. and Darrell McKay, R.T.; Western Counselor--Jim Roach, R.T. Suggestions were made as to who might be willing and able to fill the vacancy of Treasurer on the ballot.

WESTERN COUNSELOR, Merlin Heinselman reported that if reservations for a minimum of thirty passenger could be obtained by September 1, 1974, the Kansas City area would charter a bus to the MSRT annual convention. Full information will be presented with the convention flyer.

Merline Heinselman proposed an outline form to be used as a guide for individuals in submitting information to the MSRT Employment Placement Bureau. Phyllis McEnerney motioned, and Norman Hente seconded, the Birth, Height, Weight, Marital Status, Military Service and High School graduation categories be removed from this form. Motion carried. After much discussion, Donna Cassell Moved that these changes be made in the outline: To delete the Professional Positions portion of

a heading on page 1; on page 2, to specify the American Registry of Radiologic Technologist certification number and date issued, to list work experiences in reverse order, to add and Professional Offices to the heading Professional Membership, and to use Work References instead of just references. Norman Hente seconded the motion and motion carried. The information received by this Bureau will be kept on file only thirty days unless the applicant notifies the Bureau to keep his data on file for a longer period of time. The revised outlines will soon be available.

A list of Doctors and Hospitals still employing unregistered x-ray personnel was updated and is to be sent to Mr. Betts of the Missouri Hospital Association.

There is no information from the PROFESSIONAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE since the newsletter was never published and no report has been presented to the Board. Information from this committee should be printed in the Missouri Minutes issue to be published in August. The \$50.00 given the committee to produce the newsletter shall be returned to the Treasury.

A very detailed report was presented by Bob Rein describing the LICENSURE COMMITTEE'S recent activities. A proposed licensure bill was submitted to the Board. It was decided to have Rabbitt, Rabbitt, and Dickerson law firm review this bill and get into appropriate condition to mail to all of the Registered Technologists of Missouri, with a cover letter stating it was the wish of the MSRT membership to take steps in this direction. The proposed bill is to be studied and a decision will be made at the MSRT convention as whether to go on with it or not. If the bill is to succeed it will need determined sponsors and a large united Missouri Society to back it.

MEMBERSHIP - Mary Sebacher reported as of April 25, 1974, the membership included Ron Ott thought that these figures showed an increas over last year, even with the dues increase effective 1974-1975.

Motion was made by Bob Rein to instruct the Treasurer to follow ASRT guidelines in handling renewal fees and dues for members who join after January 1st or April 1st. Norman Hente seconded and the motion carried.

A letter was read from ASRT regarding the exhibit entry for the student and affiliate society at the ASRT convention. One entry is permitted from each state in each of these categories.

Phyllis McEnerney moved that students in the state, who are members of ASRT and who wish to participate, prepare an exhibit to be judge on Juna 1, 1974, at a central meeting place by a group of judges appointed by the President. This will decide which student exhibit will be presented from Missouri. Mike McMasters seconded and motion carried.

Orvil Sikes moved that MSRT pay the \$5.00 entry fee for the student who will present an exhibit in the ASRT competition. Mike McMasters seconded and motion was defeated.

Mike McMasters moved to take \$100.00 from the Treasury to help finance the exhibiting student's trip to Philadelphia. Mary Sebacher seconded and the motion carried.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE sent ballots out in March, with 40 persons nominated by the MSRT membership stated Dwayne TerMaat. This mail voting is proving to be an asset to our society.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE reported informally one hundred one persons attending the seminar presented by the University of Missouri, Columbia, the majority being staff technicians. The committee is still requesting suggestions for their roster of speakers being compiled, and also, for questions for the mock registry being compiled also states Mary Sebacher.

CONVENTION CITY COMMITTEE - Mike McMasters contacted Steve Johnson about the Bi-State meeting between the Missouri and Illinois State societies, receiving no reply.

Darrel McKay moved that Norman Hente be Missouri's representative to discuss and secure information on this Bi-State meeting, due to his geographic location. Phyllis McEnerney seconded and motion carried. Ron Ott is to notify the Illinois state President of this action so that they may elect a representative to act in this capacity, also.

Judy Cortner the MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE reports she has sent districts letters urging a social gathering to provide an opportunity for non members to get acquainted with the members.

Following a letter being read from the Nebraska society concerning job availabilities, Bob Rein moved that the President appoint a committee establishing an employment placement bureau for Technologists and job opportunities within the state, with Representatives from each District funneling information to the Counselors for assimilation and distribution to prospective employers and at the same time work up a good outline in regards to what information needs to be presented by a Technologist who is seeking a job. Phyllis McEnerney seconded and motion carried. The availability of this service is to be made known through letters to organizations, professional publications, and by general word of mouth.

The PROFESSIONAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE wishes to inform the membership that Phase 4 of the Federal law that limits us to only a 5.5% raise ceases to exist April 30, 1974. When bill S3203 Passes, it will put all nonprofit hospital personnel subject to open unionization. Norman Hente moved that the MSRT retain the law firm of Rabbit, Rabbit and Dickerson for a period of six months for the fee of \$150.00 to study the history and problems of the MSRT and to be available for consultation at the rate of \$40.00 per hour when needed. Mike McMasters seconded - motion carried.

Judy Cortner moved that we increase the budget of the Professional Affairs Committee by \$50.00 in order for them to produce a newsletter within five weeks to inform the membership in detail of the progress of this committee. Norman Hente seconded and motion carried.

The resignation of Phyllis McEnerney as advisor of the Professional Affairs Committee was accepted.

Darrel McKay stated that Walter Andersen will present the Sante Memorial Lecture at the 1974 MSRT Convention and that Jack Dohrt has accepted to give this lecture at the 1975 Convention.

The guidelines for the Editor of the MISSOURI MINUTED were set down as follows:
It is felt the Missouri Minutes should be a publication of the Membership and that:

1. Editor should be appointed by the president and approved by the Board for a term of two years.
2. Associated editor should be approved by the Board upon recommendation of the editor. Official appointment to be made by the President. This should be for a 2 year term to coincide with the term of the present editor.
3. Since the Journal is a means by which the board can keep the membership informed any communication which the Board feels should be presented must be given first priority for publication. The Editor will have the prerogative of accepting or rejecting any material other than that sent to him by the Board of Directors for publication.
4. If any controversial material is submitted which criticizes any individual or the society, the editor must inform that individual criticized or chairman of the Board and give him equal opportunity to reply in the same issue.
5. The editor and associate editor will jointly approve each issue of the Journal prior to publication and submit a copy to the chairman of the Board for a permanent file.
6. It was moved by Norman Hente and seconded by Judy Cortner to delete item #6. Motion was defeated. Orvil Sikes moved that Guideline #6 read as follows: If at any time the editor or associate editor fails to comply with the accepted guidelines laid down by the Board of Directors they may be asked to submit their resignation. Bob Rein seconded and motion carried.
7. Judy Cortner moved to delete guideline #7. Mike McMasters seconded the motion and motion carried.
8. The journal is to be published by the 15th of August, November, February, and May.

Norman Hente moved that the next Missouri Minutes not be published until August 15, 1974 due to the fact that May is upon us and that any current membership news could be included in the Professional Affairs Committee Newsletter to be published within five weeks. Mike McMasters seconded - motion carried.

It was stated that Mildred Reese, R.T. will donate, to the MSRT, a complete set of the Missouri Minutes.

Phyllis McEnerney moved that Richard Chavez's recommendation for appointment of Martin Strussion as Associate Editor be accepted. Mary Sebacher Seconded and motion carried.

Judy Foeste, 1974 GENERAL CONVENTION CHAIRMAN, stated October 9 thru 11 as the dates set for the convention. Governor Bond has been asked to proclaim the week of October 7 thru 11 as Radiological Technologist week. The first flyers
