
LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Donita Shipman has assumed the duties of Legislative Activities Chairman for this 1994-1995 year. She worked on this committee last year, under the able supervision of Shawn Snider, and is jumping in with both feet already for this coming year. She has spoken with our lobbyist Harry Hill, and he is still interested in helping us pursue our legislation. Harry will meet with Donita the beginning of September to discuss the strategy for this next session. Harry stated that Senator Joe Moseley, Columbia, still supports our bill and will sponsor it again this next session. Senator Moseley feels if he gets the bill onto the Senate Floor he can get it passed. Harry also let Donita know that he is looking for a sponsor in the House of Representatives for our bill, due to the fact that Carol Roper Park is running for a different office, and will not be available to be our sponsor this year. Anyone at all having connections with a representative who could help with sponsorship should contact Donita as soon as possible.



STUDENT ACTIVITES UPDATE







1995 MSRT ANNUAL **CONFERENCE ON THE WATER!!**


