Rules and Regulations for SCIENTIFIC EXHIBIT COMPETITION

I. AWARDS

First, second, third place and honorable mention awards will be offered in both graduate and student technologist categories. Awards will be made at the discretion of the judges.

II. ELIGIBILITY

- A. Graduate technologist category: Only members of the Missouri Society of Radiologic Technologists(MSRT) are eligible to compete. Student members may be designated as co-exhibitors if they have made a significant but secondary contribution to the work.
- B. Student technologist category: Only student members of the MSRT are eligible to compete. The exhibit must be the sole work of the student member(s).
- C. Exhibits which have previously been displayed at any other state and/or national radiological or technologist meeting will not be considered for an award. However, they may be displayed on a noncompetitive basis.
- D. Exhibits must be an original presentation of the exhibitor(s).
- E. The president of the MSRT, the exhibit committee and the exhibit judges are not eligible to compete.
- F. Material contributions by secondary sources for purposes of an exhibit must be so noted.

III. RULES FOR PRESENTATION OF EXHIBIT

- A. Subject Matter
 - 1. Subject matter will be chosen by the exhibitor(s).
 - 2. The subject matter must be pertinent to the science and/or-practice of radiologic technology. For this purpose the term radiologic technology shall include all those modalities employed in the field of radiology for the diagnosis and/or treatment of disease.
 - 3. Subject matter should be of educational and/or practical value to other technologists.
- **B.** Mechanics
 - 1. All applications for exhibits must be sent by certified mail and shall be postmarked no later than thirty(30) days prior to the MSRT annual meeting. Proof of current MSRT membership or membership application and fees must accompany the exhibit application.
 - 2. The MSRT will provide four(4) 14x17" viewing spaces and one six(6) foot by thirty(30) inch table for each exhibit. Exhibitors may provide their own light sources and/or exhibit frames.
 - 3. Exhibits submitted for competition must not show any images or any markings on either side which could identify the exhibitor(s), patients or institution in any way.
 - 4. Exhibits submitted for competition must display the category for which they are competing. (ie., student, graduate technologist)
 - 5. Exhibit space will be assigned by the chairman of the exhibit committee. The name of the exhibitor(s) and place of employment or training must be given to the exhibit chairman before receiving permission to set up the display. A card displaying this information will be added to the exhibit after judging is complete.
 - 6. Exhibits and displays must be set up by 9:00 a.m. on the first full day of the meeting. Exhibits must remain on display until two(2) hours after the

awarding of prizes. Exhibits must be down and removed from the exhibit area by 12:00 p.m.(noon) the last day of the meeting. The exhibit chairman may grant exceptions to this rule under unusual circumstances, such as emergencies.

IV. JUDGING AND AWARDING OF PRIZES

- A. Three judges will be selected by the exhibit chairman with the approval of the president of the MSRT.
- B. All protests regarding eligibility and/or rule violations must be lodged with the exhibit chairman and be resolved prior to judging. No protests will be heard after judging is complete.
- C. Awards shall be made only to those exhibits receiving a minimum score of sixty-five(65) on a scale of one hundred(100) points.
- D. Results of judging shall be made known at the direction of the MSRT Board of Directors.
- E. Awarding of prizes shall be made at the banquet.
- F. Judging shall use the following scale:

Rules and Regulations for ESSAY/SCIENTIFIC PAPER COMPETITION

I. AWARDS

First, second, third place and honorable mention awards will be offered in both graduate and student technologist categories. Awards will be made at the discretion of the judges.

II. ELIGIBILITY

- A. Graduate technologist category: Only members of the Missouri Society of Radiologic Technologists(MSRT) are eligible to compete. Student members may be designated as co-authors if they have made a significant but secondary contribution to the work.
- B. Student technologist category: Only student members of the MSRT are eligible to compete. The paper must be the sole work of the student member(s).
- C. Papers submitted for competition at any other state and/or national radiological or technologist meeting or which have been accepted for publication prior to the MSRT meeting are not eligible.
- D. Papers must be an original with the author(s).
- The president of the MSRT, the essay/scientific paper committee and judges are not eligible to compete.

 III. RULES FOR PRESENTATION OF EXCEPTION

A. Subject Matter

- 1. Subject matter will be chosen by the author(s).
- 2. The subject matter must be pertinent to the science and/or practice of radiologic technology. For this purpose the term radiologic technology shall include all those modalities employed in the field of radiology for the diagnosis and/or treatment of disease.
- Subject matter should be of educational and/or practical value to other technologists.

B. Mechanics

- 1. All manuscripts must be sent by certified mail and shall be postmarked no later than forty-five(45) days prior to the MSRT annual meeting. The manuscript must be accompanied by an essay/ scientific application. Proof of current MSRT membership or membership application and fees must also be included.
- 2. Four(4) copies of the manuscript must be submitted: three(3) unidentified and one identified.
 3. Manuscripts must be typed and double spaced on one side of good quality white bond paper, eight and one-half inches by eleven inches (8-1/2 x 11") in size with wide margins and numbered pages securely fastened on the left side.
- 4. Manuscripts should be all least one thousand five hundred (1,500) words in length. Reading time should be ten to fifteen (10-15) minutes.
- 5. When used, references and quotes must be identifies. Non-indication of references shall be construed as plagiarism. Evidence of plagiarism shall immediately disqualify the paper.
- 6. When used, illustrations must be incorporated into the test or may be fastened to the paper in a group at the end of the manuscript. They must be properly numbered and labeled to correspond with information in the text. Illustrations must be no larger than eight by ten (8x10) inches. Slides may

be used if appropriate. The illustrations used must not show any images or markings which could identify the author(s), patients, or institution in any way.

IV. JUDGING AND AWARDING OF PRIZES

- A. Three judges will be selected by the essay/scientific paper committee chairman with the approval of the president of the MSRT.
- B. All protests regarding eligibility and/or rule violations must be lodged with the essay/scientific paper committee chairman and be resolved prior to judging. No protests will be heard after judging is complete.
- C. Awards shall be made only to those exhibits receiving a minimum score of seventy(70) on a scale of one hundred(100) points.
- D. First place winners shall be notified prior to the annual meeting. First place winners may be asked to read their paper at the meeting. Presentation is limited to twenty(20) minutes. Visual aids may be used if desired. Author(s) are responsible for preparation of these visual aids.
- E. Awards shall be announced to the membership at the direction of the MSRT Board of Directors.
- F. Awarding of prizes shall be made at the banquet.
- G. Judging shall use the following scale:
