
A message from the President:



CONTINUING EDUCATION--DO YOU GET IT YET???

Q. Who needs it, and when?

A. Beginning this year, 1995, every ARRT registered technologist may begin to accrue credits after the first day of the month that their birthday occurs in. If your birth year ends in an even number (e.g. 1938, 1964, 1976) you have until your birth month in 1997 to accumulate 24 hours of education credit. If your birth year ends in an odd number (e.g. 1941, 1959, 1981) you have until your birth month in 1998 to accumulate 36 hours of credit. After this initial enforcement period, then all technologists will be on a 2(two) year rotation.

DO YOU GET IT YET?

- Q. Who will keep track of your credits?
- A. Ultimately you, yourself, and you are responsible for maintaining a record of your education credits. However, some hospitals have in house education departments that may do that for you, and the American Society of Radiologic Technologists (ASRT) has its own ECE program and they will also keep track of this information for you. For more information on what the ASRT can and will do for you as a member call them at 1-800-444-ASRT.

DO YOU GET IT YET??

- Q. Can you earn credits with any old thing?
- A. NO. One-half of your total required credits must be of category A type hours. Category A type credit includes:
 - 1. Any program approved by a recognized continuing education evaluation mechanism(RCEEM). This included state and district lectures.
 - 2. CPR certification courses.
 - 3. AMA(American Medical Association) or American Nurses Association courses, if they are related to the radiologic sciences.
 - 4. Writing an original textbook related to radiologic sciences.
 - 5. Writing a chapter of a textbook related to radiologic sciences.
 - 6. Writing an article that is published in a peer-reviewed journal.
 - 7. Receive a grade of C or better in an approved academic course.
 - 8. Pass an entry level exam in a discipline not previously passed.
 - 9. Pass an advances level exam for which you are eligible.

Each of these options vary accordingly with the credit hours you may earn.

DO YOU GET IT YET???

- Q. What does not count toward credit?
- A. Attendance at routine department meetings, rounds, tours/viewing exhibits, elected office, committee appointments, business sessions of professional organizations, basic courses that should have been obtained during your

training, student bowls, other competitions, developments of manuals related to work responsibilities.

DO YOU GET IT YET????

- Q. What happens if you fail to meet your continuing education requirement within your allotted time frame?
- A. First you will be put on probational status. Then you may be returned to an approved status by meeting the standards within 1 (one) year. If you are on probational status and do not comply within 3 (three) years you will no longer be recognized by the ARRT as a registered technologist. During the time that you are trying to comply with your unmet requirements you are still responsible for accruing your new required credits too. It could really snowball on you if you get behind. Once the ARRT no longer recognizes you, you do realize that you will need to take the REGISTRY again to once again gain your registered status. Don't let this happen!!!!!

DO YOU GET IT YET?????

- Q. How can the MSRT help you?
- A. Local District meetings are held throughout the state. Many are monthly, some only meet during the school year, some meet the last Tuesday of every month. If you are unsure as to when your area district meets, contact your district representative, that information can be found in this Radiographer on the district update page. Usually district meetings are for 1-2 hours of credit. Districts also are having day long seminars, usually held on a saturday, with 7-9 hours of credit available. The MSRT Board has encouraged the districts to provide these seminars as a way of reaching many more MSRT members. Of course the most credits can be obtained by attending the state meeting held in the spring. This year you can attend for a day and earn 7-9 hours of credit, or you may choose to attend for the entire 4 days and earn in excess of 30 hours of credit. Of course, not everyone will be able to attend for the entire conference, but even 1 or 2 days will help you get that much closer to those required credits.

Ulysses D. Murray, RT

Mr. Murray was born in Hattiesburg, Mississippi and moved to St. Louis when he was in the second grade. After graduation from high school he attended Stowe Teachers' College & St. Louis University. He received a certificate in hospital administration from St. Louis University in 1957. His interest in x-ray began during his Navy career during World War II. After his discharge from the Navy he entered Homer Phillips School of X-Ray Technology graduating with the first class. He was registered by the ARXT in January 1949, joining the ASXT the same year. He joined the MSRT in 1950.

During his many years with the MSRT he served as President, vice-president, sccretary, chaired many committees and chaired Annual Meetings. He was associate editor of "The Missouri Minutes" and served as the Parliamentarian for over 25 years. Mr. Murray was the first Region V ASKT Regional Director. He served ASKT as General Convention Chairman in 1967, as a counselor for Missouri and as chairman of the Resolutions and Bylaws Committee in 1970.

Mr. Murray won many Exhibit awards on the state level, including in 1954 a 1st place for "Cerebral Angiography" and a 3rd in 1957 for "Zygoma". He was a published author and presented many lectures to the members of the MSRT during our annual meetings.


NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT
