Hedrick, Eaves named MSRT Life Members

The highest honor that can be given by the Missouri Society of Radiologic Technologists to any one single member is that of Life Membership. In order to be elevated to Life Membership status, the member must be an active member of the MSRT for at least 15 years. During that time he/she must have served the MSRT Board of Directors for at least five years, including service as an officer or other Board position.

This year the Missouri Society of Radiologic Technologists elevated two such members—Joan Hedrick and Chuck Eaves.

Eaves has been a member of MSRT for 17 years and an ASRT member for 10 years. He served as 6th District representative for six years; as Exhibit chair for two years; as Essay chair for one year; and as Board vice-president for one year.

In 1985 he received an associate of science degree in electronics from Mineral Area College. His career in radiology began in 1986, when Vocational Rehabilitation for Missouri State Disability sent him to Jefferson Barracks for testing to find a suitable career. He became certified in the area of medical clerical files in radiology and began work at John Cochran VA Hospital in St. Louis.

In 1987 he enrolled at Mineral Area Regional Medical Center School of Radiology. He graduated in 1989, and received the Clinical Award given by

technologists at MARMC.

In 1990 Eaves earned registration in radiologic technology, and in 1998 was certified in ultrasound through Forrest Park Community College.

Throughout the years he has worked at MARMC in Farmington; Ste.
Genevieve Memorial Hospital in Ste.
Genevieve; Southeast Memorial Hospital in Cape Girardeau; Jefferson Memorial Hospital in Festus; and for Dr. William Harris' orthopedic clinic.

He also has taught off and on since 1993 for MARMC School of Radiology. In 1993 he received the Rookie Teacher of the Year award, and in 1996 earned the Golden Apple Award. "All my appreciation goes to Vocational Rehab; Henry Cashion, program director of the MARMC School of Radiologic Technology; Janice Hickman, clinical coordinator; Brandi Grindel, assistant program director; all teachers, technologists, and the MSRT Board of Directors; and, most of all, the students," says Eaves.

"Medical imaging has been and will always be part of my life. The MSRT surprised me this April with a lifetime membership card. Currently, I have been on disability for 1 1/2 years because of health reasons, but with the Lord willing, I will be back to work soon."


