

ASRT increases dues, adopts resolutions

Six MSRT members represented Missouri June 4-7 at the ASRT Annual Conference in Orlando, Fla.

Attending were David Frazier and Dean Brake, Missouri affiliate delegates; Dr. Anne Rutz, education delegate; Donita Shipman, mammography delegate; Ben Morris, radiation therapy delegate; and Barb Hente, nuclear medicine delegate.

The ASRT House of Delegates voted to raise dues for active and associate members by \$20 to \$105 per year, effective Oct. 1, 2005. It is the first dues increase in six years.

The House voted on 27 resolutions and adopted 18. Delegates also passed several amendments to the ASRT bylaws and approved a bylaws implementation plan, effective with the upcoming 2006 elections.


