Missouri technologists gather for RT in JC

I want to personally thank the nearly 100 attendees for their participation at the RT in JC advocacy event on February 12, 2014. What an impression we made on our legislators! It is a privilege to show our lawmakers what we do and what an important part of healthcare we provide each and every day. Also, I'd like to send a special thank you to Becky Apodoca and Roman Moore who were on hand as the representatives from the ASRT. In addition to meeting with our state legislators, the MoSRT also presented our first "Legislator of the Year" award to Representative Higdon, the sponsor of HB 1060.

As a result of our efforts at RT in JC, Representative Burlison, the chairman of the Professional Licensure committee, announced he will give HB 1060 a hearing during this session. In fact, this will be the *only* licensure bill he will hear this session, so we should feel very privileged! Be sure to visit http://www.mosrt.org/legislative.html frequently, as I will be posting updates here.

I hope each of you were as satisfied with your day. Make sure you follow up with your legislators with an e-mail or phone call. Tell them "thank you," remind them of the reason you were there, and ask if they need any additional information. Be sure you give them your contact information.

Do not let this momentum end! We need to keep being the advocates for our profession, even after we achieve state licensure. Remember advocacy does not stop with the passage of HB 1060. Be an advocate for our profession by bringing education and an understanding of what we do to our peers.



Due to growth of the society and the increasing number of attendees at the annual conference, the location was moved to the Lake of the Ozarks. Now, 16 years later, the MoSRT still follows the "TEAM" philosophy, but is heading in a "New Direction" back to Columbia, MO.

The year was 1998; the place, the Holiday Inn Executive Center in Columbia, Missouri. The U.S. President was Bill Clinton, Y2K was just beyond the horizon and "9-11" was known only as a way to contact emergency personnel. We were five years post the Midwest flood of '93 and seven years post Desert Storm.

The 1997-98 MSRT President presiding over the 66th Annual Conference was Donita Shipman. The Conference Coordinator was Norman Hente and the theme for the meeting was <u>Together</u>

<u>Everyone Achieves More!</u> David Frazier was Program Chair and Ed Passman was the incoming President. Debra Hurst was elevated to Life Member status. Danny Cantrell presented the Ulysses D. Murray Memorial Lecture, "A look from the other side—what If you were the patient?"

Coretta Schroer received the Mallinckrodt Award of Excellence. Nicole Fuller of Avila College was awarded the MSRT Student Scholarship and Bonnie

(Brown) Ernst from Mineral Area College was the recipient of the Robert A. Feldhaus Scholarship.

The MSRT Technologist Scholarships were presented to Debra Hurst and Kristi Littleton. The Research Medical Center students were winners of the Student Bowl Competition; 11 teams participated in all. Seventeen past-Presidents were on hand at the 66th annual conference. The attendance for this meeting was 370, representing the states of Illinois, Kansas, Missouri and Texas. Membership dues were only \$35 for active and supporting members and \$20 for inactive and student members.

It has been 16 years since we held our annual conference in this location. I believe we moved to the Lake of the Ozarks because of the growth of the MSRT; we now we return to Columbia to economize. Here's to another successful conference!
